6. STATEMENT HATS:


Instead of just throwing on a beanie, statement hats are everywhere. These pieces can be big, fun and can completely make a look into something else. Fashion.

Wilkes-Barre School District adds options to school uniform policy

While dress codes at the 12 major public school districts in Luzerne County have the same basic structure to them, there are variations on the codes that differ depending on the school.

In the Wilkes-Barre Area School District, students are expected to dress in solid-color pants in colors from khaki to navy blue, and no cargo pants or athletic wear is allowed.

Last month, the Wilkes-Barre Area School Board voted to add jeans to the list of allowed pants. Students are forbidden from wearing tank tops, or hats under any circumstances. Collarless shirts, such as T-shirts are also allowed, as long as they are solid colors or stripes. Shirts can have large logos or writing on them if the design is spirit related, such as school mascot images.

The hat rule is one thing that is unanimously upheld throughout Luzerne County, with all 12 public school districts disallowing the wearing of hats or headwear in schools.

One thing unique to the Wilkes-Barre Area School district is the inclusion of a Dress Code Exemption form, which allows the student to bypass the school's dress code for religious or medical reasons.

When venturing outside of Wilkes-Barre, school dress codes begin to change.

At Crestwood in Mountain Top, the dress code is much more lax, allowing for students to dress in a "manifestation of personal style and individual preference."

This same stance has been adopted at Hazleton Area and Northwest Area, as well.

At Holy Redeemer, the dress code is ramped up a few notches, with students wearing strict uniforms reflecting the school's status

as a private school.

MOM JEANS



